Symposia

There are a wide range of symposia being offered: 29 themed ones, and a general one to cater for those of you whose research does not fall into the symposia proposed. Note that although the symposium conveners have already identified possible speakers, if your work falls within the scope of any of the symposia, when you register, you should select the symposium that most aligns to your research area.

Travel Grants

There are a few travel grants already advertised on our website. Note that some are specifically targeted for delegates from other parts of Africa, postgraduate students from around the world, and there are two specific ones for Argentinian delegates.

Accommodation

There are several different accommodation types available that will suit all pockets. There will be extremely reasonably priced University residence accommodation available (the cheapest has 2 person shared bedrooms, and shared bathroom facilities), but there are others that have private rooms and bathrooms with shared kitchen facilities, and yet others that are completely private. The booking for these University accommodations will be open from early January.

Aside from the University accommodation, there are several B & Bs, that are a short walk to the venue. Hotels are abit further out, but easily accessible to the venue by car. There are parking areas available near the venue, in case you wish to stay further out and drive in each day.
